Gun violence, reform and the voice of healthcare

Statewide poll shows broad concern about gun violence and majority support for reform. Healthcare is looked to as a trusted voice in the discussion.

Key findings: There is consensus and trust in TN

A majority of Tennesseans in both parties and across the state say they worry about gun violence and broadly support proposed action to reduce it. For clinicians and healthcare leaders, there is a clear mandate from the public to be part of the conversation in addressing this public health crisis.



Common Ground

Across political parties, state geography and gun ownership, a strong majority of Tennesseans rate gun violence as a serious problem in the state. And, that majority also supports reforms proposed by Tennessee Governor Bill Lee to help solve it.



Trust to Speak


Nearly six in 10 Tennessee adults agree that gun violence is a public health crisis, and 75 percent trust the point of view of doctors, nurses and hospital leaders when it comes to the issue. More than 80 percent say it's important for those in healthcare to be active in the conversation about gun violence.


of Tennessee adults say they frequently worry about gun violence How often, if ever, do you worry that you or someone you love will be a victim of gun violence?




SAFE STORAGE




EXTREME RISK PROTECTION

Allow authorities to temporarily remove guns from people who pose a risk to themselves or others. These are sometimes called Extreme Risk Laws or Order of Protection Laws.





Close current gun sale loopholes by requiring all commercial sales of guns to include a 72-hour background check of the buyer before purchase.






SCHOOL SECURITY



Healthcare professionals are highly trusted when it comes to discussing gun violence


Thinking only about gun violence issues, please indicate how much you trust the point of view of each of the following groups or leaders.


